Code of Conduct for Parents and Carers

Effective from 13 August 2009

- Encourage your child to attend club coaching sessions and to learn new skills
- Encourage your child to learn the rules and compete within them.
- Discourage unfair competition and arguing with officials.
- Help your child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Never force your child to take part in orienteering or to run a course they are not ready for.
- Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performance of all.
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Publicly accept officials' judgements.
- Support your child's involvement and help them enjoy their orienteering.
- Use correct and proper language at all times.
- Fair play in orienteering should be encouraged e.g. not seeking an unfair advantage, not complaining about the map, courses or control placement to justify a bad run. Not tampering with controls and not entering out of bounds areas.
- Showing respect for the countryside by taking all litter home, crossing fences and walls at only provided crossing points and closing all gates.
- Carry out your orienteering activities with a spirit of fair play.
